Approving the selection of the tender for acquisition of Hyperconnectivity
Services for HPC Systems

THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE EuroHPC JOINT UNDERTAKING,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EU) 2021/1173 of 13 July 2021 on establishing the European High Performance Computing Joint Undertaking and repealing Regulation (EU) 2018/1488¹, in particular Article 15 thereof,

Having regard to the Statutes of the European High Performance Computing Joint Undertaking annexed to the Regulation (thereinafter "Statutes") and in particular to Articles 1(i), 6(7), and 7(7)(d) thereof,

Having regard to the Council Regulation (EU) 2024/1732 of 17 June 2024 amending Regulation (EU) 2021/1173 as regards a EuroHPC initiative for start-ups in order to boost European leadership in trustworthy artificial intelligence²,

Having regard to EuroHPC Joint Undertaking Financial Rules approved by the Governing Board Decision No 03/2020 of 20 February 2020³ and in particular to Article 43 thereof,

Having regard to Governing Board Decision No 55/2024 of 28 November 2024 approving the mandate to the Executive Director to launch the call for tenders for the acquisition of Hyperconnectivity services for HPC systems in Europe,

WHEREAS

- (1) The mission of the EuroHPC Joint Undertaking is to develop, deploy, extend and maintain in the Union a world-leading federated, secure and hyper-connected supercomputing, quantum computing, service and data infrastructure ecosystem,
- (2) By Decision No 55/2024 of 28 November 2024, the Governing Board the mandate to the Executive Director to launch the call for tenders for the acquisition of Hyperconnectivity Services for HPC Systems in Europe. The call for tenders was launched on 16 December 2024, with deadline provided on 14 March 2025. Within the deadline, two applications were submitted in response to the above-referred call for tenders,
- (3) The evaluation procedure followed the applicable public procurement rules for open procedures in the terms provided in the EU Financial Regulation. The Evaluation Committee was appointed by the Responsible Authorising Officer of the EuroHPC Joint Undertaking. Three external experts selected by EuroHPC Joint Undertaking assisted the Evaluation Committee with a detailed technical analysis against the award criteria,
- (4) Two submitted applications were deemed eligible and administratively compliant. The tenders have been evaluated by the Evaluation Committee (award criteria) and persons involved in the evaluation (exclusion criteria and selection criteria). The Evaluation Committee, taking into account external experts' individual evaluation reports, concluded that both tenders passed all mandatory technical requirements as described in the technical specifications part of the call for tenders and one tender was superior to the other. The Evaluation Committee recommended to the Executive Director to award the contract to the superior tenderer. More details on the evaluation procedure are provided in the annexed evaluation report,
- (5) The Executive Director has submitted the Evaluation Report to the Governing Board,
- (6) The Governing Board took note of the outcome of the evaluation, which included the Evaluation Report with annexes. Consequently, the Governing Board

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The Governing Board hereby approves the selection of the tender for the acquisition of Hyperconnectivity services for HPC systems in Europe, in accordance with the annual Work Programme of the EuroHPC Joint Undertaking for the year 2024, and within the agreed available budget.

Article 2

The Executive Director shall inform the tenderers of the results of the evaluation and shall communicate simultaneously the relevant criteria scoring and analysis.

Article 3

This Decision shall enter into force on the date of its adoption.
